Transportation

Clothing and Other Equipment

Average temperatures in this area in April can range from lows in the mid 30s to highs in the 80's. The course will be held rain, snow, blazing sun, or haboob (giant dust storms in the desert), so participants should bring rain and snow gear and warm layers to account for unexpected cold or precipitation. Hats and sunscreen are recommended for sun protection. All equipment and supplies for the hands-on teaching sessions will be provided. You should bring any equipment that you carry during your normal outings, such as a backpack to transport personal gear and items such as a personal medical kit, trekking poles, water filtration, fire-starting equipment, etc. Additionally, feel free to bring any equipment, medical or otherwise, that you want to test out in the field.
